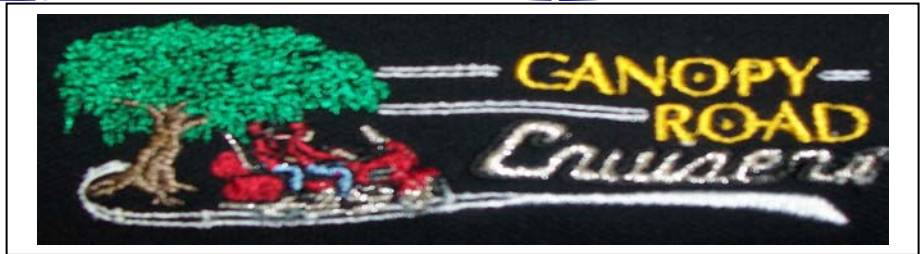

If you didn't make the fourth American Motorcyclist Association Women In Motorcycling (WIM) conference June 30 to July 3, 2006, you *missed out!* Women (and some men) from at least 48 states and a few foreign countries attended the Conference in Athens, Georgia.

My husband, Mike and I rode up on Thursday, June 29th on our 1100cc Honda Shadows. After a hot ride and a small side trip getting lost in Athens we finally got settled at the Days Inn.

The Conference included demo rides by Harley-Davidson and Buell, Honda, Kawasaki, Ducati, BMW, Yamaha, KYMCO and Ridley. Since Harley and Buell were major sponsors they got a prime location in front of the Athens Classic Center. The other manufacturers set up in the parking garage/

Mike rode a Harley *Screamin' Eagle ultra Classic Electra Glide*, a Yamaha 1300cc *Road Star* and a KYMCO 500cc scooter. Of course he especially liked the \$32,000 Harley! I rode a Harley *Softail Deluxe*, Honda VTX 1300, Yamaha 1100cc *V-Star* and a KYMCO 250cc bike. All of the bikes had some good features. I'll take one motorcycle a la carte, please!

An excellent workshop on accident scene management was presented by a registered nurse. This is vital information we all need to know in case we have to handle a mishap before first responders arrive. There is also a seven-hour course for laymen and advanced courses for EMTs or above taught by an EMT in Navarre, FL. Three women who finished the Iron Butt rally (11,000 miles in 11 days) at different times presented a seminar on how they prepared their BMWs and themselves. A few of their tips:
